FOREWORD

For twenty years the International Water Color Exhibition has been an institution in Chicago. A representative selection from it, sent on circuit, has also been enjoyed each year by university galleries and other museums in an area extending from Pittsburgh to Denver. It is an exhibition which is extremely popular with our museum visitors, usually evokes a good word from the critics, and is one to which entrance is eagerly sought by artists.

Although the international character has always been an important feature of this exhibition, a year ago the foreign emphasis was of necessity directed to Latin America rather than to Europe. This year Mexico again accounts largely for the foreign section of the exhibition, since it was impossible to obtain material from Europe, though many European artists now living in this country have been included in the American section.

The presence of numerous European painters among us does not appear to have caused American artists to turn again towards continental methods; on the contrary it would seem that our recently arrived visitors have a tendency to become Americanized.

Impossible as it is to generalize on anything so varied as water color painting as practiced in this country today, one can nevertheless note certain tendencies. Opaque mediums continue to be popular, while transparent tones are often used in conjunction with pen and ink, more in the nature of a wash drawing than of a pure water color in the conventional Sargent tradition. Color is being used more freely and with greater understanding of its functional possibilities. Art with a mission is fortunately well on its way out. Social Consciousness and the hard bitten American Scene were growing pain phenomena of the thirties and have for the most part given way to honest interpretations of American life and American country or city surroundings, with emphasis placed on good painting rather than on descriptive realism, details which come more appropriately from the writer's pen than from the painter's brush. Since nearly all of the works in the exhibition were executed before America's entrance into the war, it is not surprising that themes bearing directly on military or naval activities are present in only four or five examples. It is, therefore, too soon to make any observations as to what effect the war is having on American artists.

Humor injects a welcome spirit of levity into the exhibition. Imaginative themes and inventive approaches indicate that many of our artists are ever alert to new ideas and the fresh possibilities of their mediums. Imaginative subjects have in some instances been carried into the field of surrealism, but ventures in this direction are less frequent than in the past few years. There are a few well-constructed abstracts in the exhibition, but this approach too appears to be practiced by a very limited number of artists.

Landscapes and city scenes continue to account for the greatest number of water colors for the obvious reason that they afford the artist the opportunity of painting out of doors directly from observation; many such sketches made on the spot will serve to inspire more ambitious work carried out later in the studio. Fewer still lifes are noted, and a corresponding increase in compositions featuring groups of people. Human activities have an obvious appeal especially when treated without self-consciousness. The formally posed figure has interest only as an academic study, even as floral pieces tend to be used as experiments in color rather than as the literally represented set piece.

Perhaps a period of over-emphasis on the grim side of life has induced a number of artists to seek relaxation in the picturesque and the romantic. In any case the curlicues of New Orleans cast iron and the gingerbread of Victorian Gothic cottages are much in evidence, treated, however, as a source of lively pattern and not with a feeling of sentimentality.

Whatever the American artist's approach to water color may be, it is more than ever true that he understands the medium perfectly and has made more varied and more effective uses of it than the artists of any other country.

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BIOGRAPHICAL NOTES ON THE PRIZE WINNERS

RAYMOND BREININ was born in Vitebsk, Russia, in 1908. As a boy he studied with the painter Uri Penn and later at the Vitebsk Academy of Art. After coming to this country he attended Saturday classes at the Art Institute and evening classes at the Chicago Academy of Art. He designed murals for the Elgin State Hospital and the Wilmette Post Office, and has during the last five years been included in most of the important American exhibitions throughout the country. His painting is highly imaginative and possesses a nostalgic mood which no doubt recalls the church towers and white houses of his native Vitebsk. He won the William and Bertha Clusmann Prize in 1940 and the Joseph N. Eisendrath Prize in 1942 at the Art Institute.

HARDIE GRAMATKY was born in Dallas, Texas, in 1907. He studied at the Chouinard Art Institute in Los Angeles and worked under Barse Miller, Clarence Hinkle, and F. Tolles Chamberlin. He had a one-man exhibition at the Ferargil Gallery in New York in 1937, and has been a frequent exhibitor at the Whitney Museum, Brooklyn Museum, The Art Institute of Chicago, as well as numerous others. He has won prizes at the Los Angeles Museum, the California State Fair, and California Water Color Society, and is represented in the permanent collections of the Brooklyn Museum, Toledo Museum, and several private collections.

BRIGGS DYER was born in Atlanta, Georgia, in 1911. He studied at the School of the Cincinnati Art Museum and at the School of The Art Institute of Chicago, where he is now an instructor. His work has been shown in the leading museums and at associations throughout the country, and is owned by a number of private collectors. He has received both a Prize and an Honorable Mention at the Portland Art Museum. He is especially noted for his colorful and freely handled scenes in and around Chicago, with occasional representations of the South.
