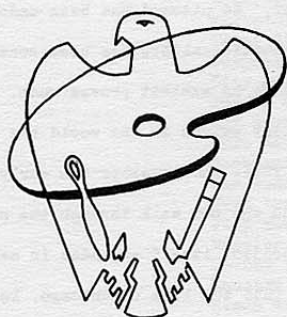

# FOREWORD

For many years it has been the custom of the Art Institute to arrange special showings of Chicago art during the summer. This year, due to cooperation with the Federal Art Project of the Works Progress Administration, Chicago is invited to study the significant accomplishments which our artists have created under this national program. Named "Art for the Public by Chicago Artists" the exhibit reports a wide variety of styles and expressions.

Nine galleries of the Exhibition Wing are filled with easel paintings in oil, tempera and water color, sculpture in several materials, mural painting (including finished panels, sketches and models showing murals in place), prints, posters and stage designs. One gallery has been given over to carefully rendered plates from the Index of American Design. All these exhibits were selected by the Staff of the Institute, aided by the Directors and departmental heads of the Project, from many times this quantity of material. No attempt has been made to show work by every artist employed but rather aesthetic calibre has been constantly stressed.

The high performance of such an exhibit proves much. The Federal Government in suddenly becoming the greatest patron in the world has contributed incalculably to the rise of American art. Those who remember the early days of the Government's first experiments with PWAP and who now walk through the present exhibition may well be amazed. Not only has the project itself expanded in many useful social directions, knitting itself more and more into the life of Chicago, but under it, individual talents have developed and grown into maturity. Given a chance to work for you, the Chicago artist has emerged from his isolation and is in the process of creating a typical and vital art.

In one way the exhibition is unique. All the artists have been paid for every work in it. Nothing is for sale; everything remains the property of the Federal Government. Each example has been assigned or will be assigned to some tax-supported institution where you and I and our children may continue to enjoy it.

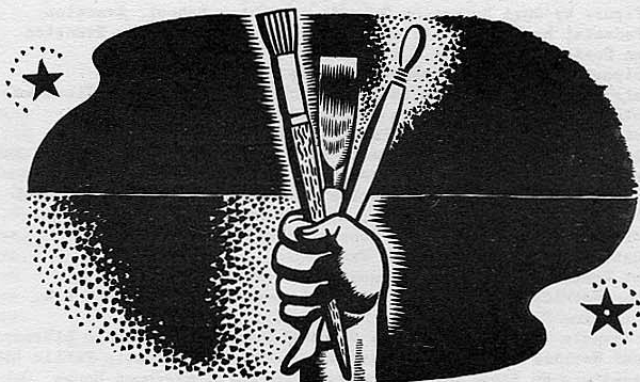

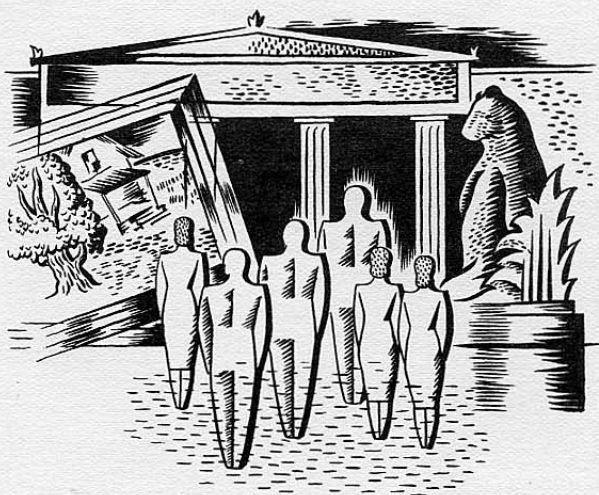
